


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# How to share papers

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Sharing papers is easy and incredibly helpful in connecting with your community and sharing valuable resources. There are two main ways to share papers :



Share a **single paper** by using a nifty URL that drops the recipient directly into the full-text paper.



Share a **collection of papers** saved in Read by QxMD via Email, Facebook or Twitter

## THE TOP REASONS AN INSTITUTION OR INDIVIDUAL WILL TYPICALLY USE THIS FEATURE:

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1. Helps to increase engagement with subscriptions
2. Decreases paper waste and the need for excessive photocopying
3. Copyright compliant! Instead of downloading and circulating papers you can provide a citation reference link.
4. Those that are part of your institution's community will have access through the proxy.
5. This a valuable education tool for people who run journal clubs/courses.



Using this URL QxMD has created we can drop a user directly into a full-text paper. Here is a little breakdown of how it works.

[http://qxmd.com/r/\[PMID\]](http://qxmd.com/r/[PMID])


[PMID] is the article's PubMed ID. Update this URL with the PubMed ID and then share it however you like.



# Sharing collections of papers

Creating collections can help you and your institution share valuable articles. It's a living, breathing tool that can be easily updated and maintained. Followers of collections are immediately alerted as new content is added.

Simply favourite a paper to add it to one of your collections!
